On Thursday we were lead through the Stations of the Cross which detail the events leading up to Jesus's death. The days from Holy Thursday through to Easter Sunday are known as the Easter Triduum. During this time, we think about Jesus's death, his crucifixion and his resurrection on Easter Sunday. It is a time of contrast: Light and Darkness, Despair and Elation, Death and Everlasting Life. We celebrate Easter Sunday with the theme, "He is Risen!"

Across the school we have enjoyed an action-packed term. Some highlights have been our Harmony Day Celebrations, Carnevale, our Open Night and fortnightly assemblies. Holy Week

Holy Week is in full swing with daily Liturgies presented by our Year 5 children to the whole school community.

Each Liturgy is a prayerful part of Jesus's last week before his crucifixion and death on Good Friday. Every Catholic community throughout the world commemorates this sacred time starting with the washing of the feet on Holy Thursday night. All over the world, this week is being celebrated in a sacred and respectful way. But what does it mean for us today?

The washing of the feet by Jesus for his disciples is a timely reminder that we are born to contribute to the world, to enhance it and to make our lives and the lives of others better when we practise servant leadership. Helping others and putting ourselves second is the way of fulfillment and finding meaning and purpose in life.

A life lived just for me is a life of selfishness. It is selfishness that Jesus challenged people about: selfishness to do what I want instead of considering others. YEAR 6 AQUATICS

On Wednesday 6 March the Year 6 cohort went to the West Lakes Aquatics Centre for a day. We went kayaking, surfing, snorkelling and sailing.

We learnt different techniques when paddling a kayak. The three ways were to paddle backwards, forwards, how to turn, and how to stop our kayak. We also learnt how to build a raft with our kayaks. Building a raft means that if there is an emergency, kayakers could communicate with other kayakers, and it is easier for emergency aircraft to see us. A raft is when all of the kayaks conjoin by kayakers holding on to each other's boats.

Next, we did surfing. For this activity, we had to leave the centre and cross the road towards the local beach. There the instructors told us the rules and explained the expectations and boundaries of the water. Then they explained how to transition from lying on the board to standing. From a lying position, we had to go into a push up position then had to move our leg up and push up into a sideways position with our knees bent and arms out straight.

One of our favourite things we did was snorkelling because we loved seeing the fish swimming around us. We also really enjoyed sailing and learning how to sail the boat while having great conversations with our friends and instructors. Also, while we were sailing, the instructors manoeuvred the boat so we could touch the water and some of us fell out. This was really fun on such a hot day.

In conclusion, we highly recommend visiting the West Lakes Aquatics Centre. We learnt so many skills while having fun with our friends.

SCHOOL CARD APPLICATIONS
