



Dear Students, Staff and Families,

This week through our Parish Team we have been reflecting on our own prayer life. One of the challenges in life is finding time to look after ourselves. This can mean many things — our physical wellbeing, our mental wellbeing and our spiritual wellbeing. Finding strength and connection with God through prayer is something we know helps us. It also replenishes us and our ability to help and serve others. This remains a focus for us through Lent.

This year we have continued to speak about and focus on our St Augustine's Values. We have been using the phrase RISE in TRUTH. 70 years ago, the St Augustine Parish School was becoming a reality! The Archdiocese of Adelaide planned a new school for the families of Salisbury. We will share with you the journey from newspaper clippings and vintage photos from time to time.

Celebrating 70 years at St Augustine's Parish School

1954: News snippet:

For New School in Salisbury.

The St Augustine auxiliary has arranged a fete in the RSL Hall, Salisbury.

It will be opened by Mrs Frank Condon, wife of the Deputy Leader of the Opposition.

Senior boarders of St Dominic's Priory College, North Adelaide will form a quard of honour.

Our school welcomed the Dominican Sisters from North Adelaide in 1955. They taught the children every day in a red brick building without modern amenities. The building was demolished a long time ago. The Sisters wore ankle length black and cream habits and drove every day from North Adelaide to Salisbury. This year, the staff of St Augustine's will be exploring our Dominican story and will be re-igniting our links to this important Charism.

Project Compassion and Lent

Sunday 4 March was the third Sunday of Lent. We encourage children to practice the virtues of prayer and giving money to the Project Compassion box which is in each classroom. This 'living for others' focus supports the poor and goes a long way to helping children understand the value of giving to others.

NEW SMOKING LAWS

From the 1 March 2024 new smoking laws have been introduced in South Australia. It is now illegal to smoke or vape at various outdoor locations including early childhood services premises, and education and children's services facilities (including schools), and within ten (10) metres of their boundaries. Smoking or vaping on school grounds or within 10meters of the boundary fence will incur a \$105 fine. More information can be found on the SA Health website clearingtheair.sa.gov.au
