EAL NEWS

Did you know?

- “EAL” stands for **English** as an **Additional language**
- Many children at St Augustine’s are either bilingual or multilingual as they speak more than one language at home other than English
- Approximately 40% of parents and families in our school community come from non-English speaking backgrounds
- Some children have only recently arrived in Australia from a non-English speaking country and EAL support is offered to them to develop their proficiency of English
- Regular EAL support is offered to those children who are at the beginning and emerging phases of learning English
- There are approximately 40 different nationalities that enrich our school community
- Two specialist EAL teachers, regularly support the children with their specific language and literacy needs

This Term we look forward to many new exciting learning experiences and successes with the children. Below is an overview of what to expect:

Reception to Year 2 students will be working with a variety of rich oral language activities. For example, guessing from an estimation jar; kite flying; story sequencing, writing, storytelling and much more.

Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 students have been supported in class during Maths, Report genre, Science and STEM lessons. We also have been looking at vocabulary, key words, headings, text structures, reading and comprehending questions.

Year 7 students have been working on a Grammar project and visual texts.

EAL teachers Maria Catalano and Anne-Maree Carr met recently with Mrs Dennis, Year 6/7 teachers Sally Glasson and Esme Rivas for a transition meeting for our 6/7 EAL students to high school. Also in attendance were Thomas More College’s Year 7 Co-ordinator Ms Kerri Anne Frost and EAL teacher Ms Nishani Singh. We discussed the activities completed in our 2018 EAL program and the specific needs of our 6/7 EAL students to ensure their smooth transition to high school in 2019.

Georgia's Renewal Leave

For the last two weeks of last term, and into the school holidays, Georgia joined a number of other school leaders from Catholic Education, including Josette Charles, on a Retreat and Pilgrimage in Scotland. Please enjoy reading Georgia's reflections:

"The real highlight of my trip was the Retreat at the Redemptorist Monastery at Kinnoul, just outside of Perth in Scotland. The Spiritual Director was Fr Jim McManus who was ably supported by Marie Hogg. The Retreat explained the notion that we are all made in the image of God, and that what God made is good. This has implications for how we see ourselves. God's goodness is reflected in the way we see ourselves, treat ourselves, conduct ourselves, and therefore how we see and treat others. It was a transformational retreat where we learned that self-esteem is an 'inside job', rather than the result of the influences of others.

I am incredibly grateful for the opportunity to share this rich experience with some of my colleagues from Catholic Education, in the beautiful environs of the Monastery, and indeed Scotland in general."

October has been recognised as **NUDE FOOD MONTH**.
As a Year Four focus we have been studying waste and the effect of plastic on the environment.
In consultation with school leadership and Mrs Dobbin in the canteen, we will be having a Nude Food Day each **Tuesday** for the month of October.
Depending on its success it may continue for the rest of the year.

The idea of Nude Food Day is to reduce the use of **SINGLE USE PLASTICS**. We are encouraging children, parents and staff to reduce the use of single use plastics in recess, lunch and snacks in the aim of reducing the amount that goes to landfill.



Students from Year Four Pahl will visit classrooms over the next two weeks showing how we can reduce the use of single use plastics when choosing our lunch and recess options.

TERM 4 SCHOOL FEES

School Fee Statements were posted home last week and if you have any queries please contact me to discuss. As we are nearing the end of another year, all school fees should be paid in full by 26 October 2018 (unless you have a payment plan in place that is sufficient to cover the fees by the end of the year or if alternative arrangements have been made).

If you are having difficulties in meeting the deadline of 26 October 2018, please contact the Finance Office to make an agreement/payment arrangement.

All overdue school fees will be charged a \$50 overdue fee. This includes Direct Debit, Centrepay deductions, BPayments and Direct Credits that will not cover all of this year's fees by the end of the year. If you need to check your calculation to ensure that your fees are paid in full, please contact me either in person or email me.

SIBLING ENROLMENTS - ENROLLING NOW FOR 2019 AND 2020

Parents of students already attending St Augustine's who also have children nearing school age still need to complete an Enrolment Form – please contact the Front Office if you require a Reception place in 2019. We are currently enrolling children for Term 1 intake (turning 5 before 30th April) and Term 3 intake (turning 5 before 31st October). If your child turns 5 after 31st October, they will commence school in Term 1 of the following year.

SCHOOL CARD

If you have already applied for School Card this year and have received a letter from the School Card Department stating that you are ineligible, please come and see me to apply for a re-assessment. This needs to be done prior to the next submission date, 26 October 2018 (Friday Week 2 Term 4). Also, if you have not already applied THIS YEAR, and believe that you meet the criteria to receive this discount, please do so immediately to avoid paying higher fees.
