All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day.

Someone once said that we die twice.

How is that possible?

A person dies once physically. The body no longer is alive.

A person dies twice when no one remembers them anymore.

However, the Catholic Church remembers those who have died every year and during every Mass.

On Wednesday, the Catholic community celebrates the Feast of All Saints. Traditionally, All Saints is

celebrated on 1 November and All Souls' Day is celebrated on 2 November. The Catholic Church encourages us all to live saintly lives and to practice goodness. This is especially important as we grow as our children always benefit when they are encouraged to be good and to do good.

All Souls' Day has a different focus. It is another great Feast Day of the Church and recalls all of those who have died. When we die, Catholics pray for us. Their prayers are to support those who mourn their dead loves ones and for those who are now in eternity. As a parish school community, the children and staff will be celebrating All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day.
